CONSTRUCTION UPDATE ON HANGA LUTHERAN CHURCH, UGANDA

Raymond Kaija, Dean of the Midwestern Deanery, Lutheran Church of Uganda, has been keeping us updated on the construction of the church in Hanga, which is a very remote and poor village populated by many refugees. This project is being funded by Lutheran Lay Renewal of America. Thanks to some very generous donations this year, we are providing funding for three building projects for Lutheran congregations in Uganda, in addition to funding the Naigobya Health Clinic, teachers' salaries at two Lutheran primary schools and the Lay Leaders Training Program in the LCU Eastern Deanery.

From 8th – 12th January 2025, we were able to host 1,714 youth and children for the youth gathering at Kibubura Girls Secondary school under the theme: '*And let us not grow weary of doing good,*' - Galatians 6:9. We thank God 1,385 youth and children made a commitment and received Jesus Christ as their personal Savior.

We had different speakers, i.e. His Grace, Bishop Henry Luke Orombi, former Archbishop of Uganda, as our main speaker, and Rev. Dembe Ye Yesu as our Bible expositor. The youth were involved in different activities like boy and girl mentorship talks, Bible study in different groups and training in different life skills.

This youth gathering was a success because Lutheran Lay Renewal of America provided the money for feeding the youth and children, which reduced the conference fee, hence registering more numbers for this ministry. For 2026, our 8th annual gathering will be from 14th – 18th January 2026, we request for support towards this gathering in food suppliers of \$5,714 dollars. CONSTRUCTION UPDATE FROM TRINITY LUTHERAN CHURCH, KYAHENDA



Trinity Lutheran Church is getting closer to completion

The construction project for this church in the remote highlands of Buhweju District in Southwestern Uganda is moving along quickly. It appears that it will soon be ready for the installation of the roof, after which the building will be usable by the congregation. Lutheran Lay Renewal is providing the funding for this construction project.

LIFE OF A VICAR IN BUHWEJU DISTRICT

In general, pastors and vicars in Uganda do not get paid a salary, as their parishioners are too poor to pay them. In addition, these servants of God must travel mostly on foot, and many times to remote places, to lead worship, to visit their parishioners who are not able to walk to church on Sunday, as well as to pray for the sick. Godwin Ngabarino, who is serving his vicarage year at St. John's Lutheran Church, Kiyanja, Buhweju District, sent our office some photos that illustrate these difficulties. Like many pastors and vicars, he is in need of a motorcycle or motorbike in order to reach people in this remote and mountainous area.

Godwin writes: "I'm walking long distances to reach our congregations in deep villages. Met all these in my pastoral visit, some don't have clothes to meet with us at church, some are very sick and with no money for medication, poor houses and their children don't go to school."

The financial needs of our partners in Africa are great, as Uganda and Rwanda are two of the 25 poorest countries in the world. Below is a wish list of current financial needs. Would you or your congregation be willing to help?

Lutheran Church of Uganda

\$4,500 will pay for all the annual expenses at Naigobya Health Clinic on the grounds of Naigobya Lutheran Church and School. This clinic serves the people of five remote villages in Eastern Uganda.

\$355 will pay the salaries of 6 teachers & the principal at a primary school for 1 month. Due to poverty in these areas, we are providing support as we are able for both Naigobya and Kyabazaala Lutheran Nursery and Primary Schools.

Diocese of Northwest Ankole, (Anglican) Church of Uganda

"We are looking for partners to work with us to address the matters of education, health,

food security, household income, clean water, sanitation, hygiene and afforestation. Funds are needed to build a church building for the Lutheran congregation in Ntoma, which currently is using a rental house. "Please, we need to build our own church building in Ntoma. Your prayers for the work of God in Rwanda will continue to be a blessing.
